News of the death of Prince Bartolome Murillo rocked the Camarilla last month.

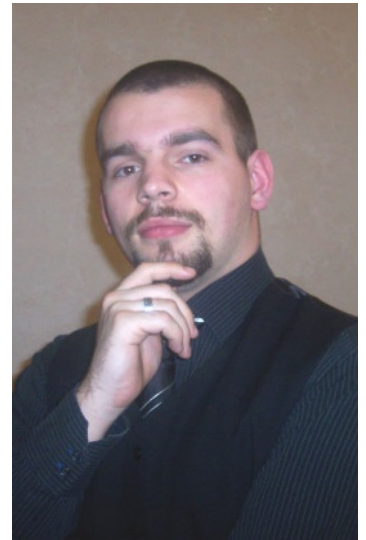

GLASGOW VAMPIRE LIVE ACTION ROLE-PLAYING

MAN JAILED FOR RAPING NEW MOTHER

A man who raped a teenage mother, eight weeks after she gave birth, has been jailed for six-and-a-half years at the High Court in Glasgow.

Thomas Wilson, 23, from Springburn, Glasgow, was found guilty of abduction and rape after a four-day trial.

His 19-year-old victim mistakenly got into his car in September last year and was taken to the grounds of Stobhill Hospital where she was raped.

Wilson will be monitored for two years in the community on his release.

The court heard Wilson followed his victim as she walked home at about midnight on 11 September.

He waved to her and she thought it was her cousin.

When she got inside the car she realised her mistake.

Wilson locked the doors and said: "Don't tell my girlfriend about this."

Giving evidence the woman, who cannot be named for legal reasons, told Kathleen Harper, prosecuting, that she begged Wilson to let her out of the car and urged him not to hurt her.

She said: "I knew something wasn't right and I took down as much information as I could about him and his car."

When asked how she felt, she said: "Scared. I was crying. I was hoping I would get out alive."

After the attack, Wilson pushed the teenager out of the car at a set of traffic lights.

Wilson denied rape and claimed his victim had agreed to consensual sex.
