Crime Rate in City Centre on the Rise

Drug-Crazed Psychopath in Blood-Lust Frenzy

Today police issued a statement about a brutal murder that was committed in a residential area in the north of the city of Glasgow last Thursday.

They have video footage of a man entering the property of the murdered woman, Sheila Thomson (aged 27), on the evening of the 29th September. Police believe that the man was on PCP as he appeared to be unaffected by horrific burns over his body. New law and order bill published

The bill will address the problem of knife crime

A bill, which aims to tackle knife crime and football-related violence, has been published in the Scottish Parliament.

The Police, Public Order and Criminal Justice (Scotland) Bill is one of the centrepieces of the Scottish Executive's legislative programme.

It includes measures to ban football hooligans from grounds and improve security around parades and marches.

Police superintendents are concerned about extra work without having additional resources.

An independent body to investigate complaints against the police will also be introduced.

Turning evidence

The bill will enhance other police powers such as the ability to prevent the anti-social use of fireworks and give the authority to take fingerprints while out on the beat.
