Riverside museum delayed

Building works on Britain's largest museum project have stopped after discovery of Iron Age artifacts during excavation work.

Less than one year ago the Lord Provost of Glasgow, Bob Winter, cut the first turf at the site of Glasgow's major museum building project, the £74million Riverside Museum.

The museum, designed by internationally renowned architect Zaha Hadid, was conceived several years ago to house the city's transport and technology collections and was expected to be completed 2011. It was expected to attract up to 1 million visitors a year, by creating a more accessible and environmentally stable home for Glasgow's significant Transport and Technology collections, including exhibiting stored materials not currently on public display. The location within Glasgow Harbour was chosen to

celebrate the river Clyde, and also to allow visiting craft to berth alongside the museum.

Professor Bill Hanson of Glasgow University, an expert on Roman archeology, especially frontier studies and acculturation, archaeological methodology and aerial archeology, said "We hope to establish the size and significance of the finding before the end of 2009 so that the museum can be finished before the games of 2014, but these things cannot be rushed."
